STARTING A ONECHILD ONE VOICE CHAPTER

Do your friends and/or classmates share your passion for action against child sex slavery? Do you live outside of Canada and the US and want to bring the movement to your country? If the answer is yes to either, then why not join together to form your own OneChild One Voice Chapter? This is your chance to unite together and stand up on behalf of vulnerable and exploited children. Your group can be formed at your school or in your community, and we'll be there to help you every step of the way. Just follow these easy steps:

STEP 1: REGISTER YOUR GROUP ON THE ONECHILD WEBSITE

Head to http://www.onechild.ca/whatwillyoudo/startachapter.php and fill out the form to register your group!

STEP 2: UNCOVER THE TRUTH

Easy there, McSpeedy. Concrete action can only be taken once we've learned the facts about the child sex trade. Get your group members to start checking out The Truth section of the OneChild website. A great idea is for each of you to take notes and share them with the group at your first meeting.

STEP 3: PLAN AND HOLD YOUR FIRST MEETING

You've registered. You know the facts. Now, it's time to get together for your first group meeting. Find a time that everyone can get together. This can be at school, at your local community centre, or at home. Make sure that you have an adult's consent and permission beforehand.

HOT TIPS

- ! Remind everyone of the meeting the day before it's to be held.
- ! Come up with a list of rules and guidelines for the group concerning attendance at meetings, group participation, voting methods, etc.
- ! It's important to hold regular meetings, so work as a group and try to come up with days and times for your meetings. Make sure everyone agrees and is happy with the decision.
- ! At the first meeting, come up with a sample agenda that can be changed and used for each meeting. (See template at the back of this guide)
- ! Work together to determine individual roles and tasks to be carried out within the group. Discuss each group member's interests and skills, and try to find roles within the group to match these.

So, to break it down, here are some ideas of roles to be filled in your groups:

1. Host (in charge of reading the agenda and addressing issues to group)



- 2. Time Keeper (makes sure meetings are kept within established time frame, and gives 'host' regular times checks to ensure time for all items on the agenda)
- 3. Note Taker (makes sure all points discussed are written down, as well as names of those in attendance, and topics of interest for next meeting. Notes should be brought to each meeting for reference.)
- 4. Communications Coordinator (keeps up-to-date records of group members contact information, and inform everyone about group meetings times, and announcements via email or phone.



STEP 4: TAKE ACTION

You've had your first meeting, and it's now your second. Now's the time to decide: what will you do? There are plenty of ideas for getting involved and getting your OneChild OneVoice chapter out there!
